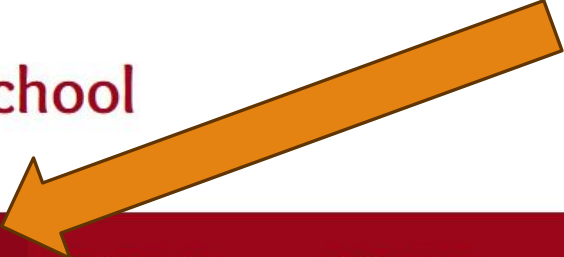

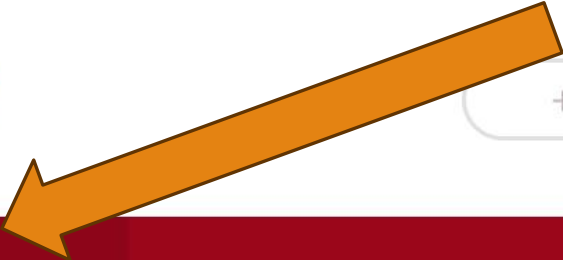

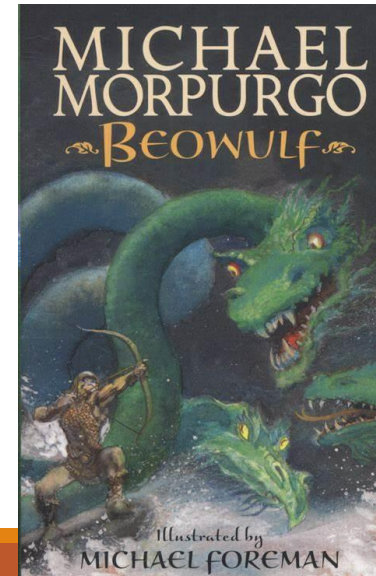

SPORTING EVENTS
